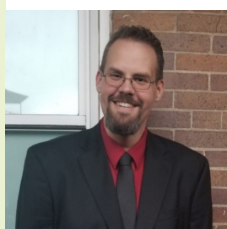


### CCSAP's New Faces

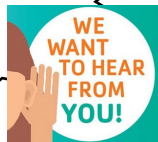
